#### COUNCIL MEETING - February 9, 2020

The meeting was called to order, and began with a prayer, by Pastor Jay Wiesner...

Council members present: Kelvin Lashley, Paul Saunders, Donna Jones, Roland Niemann, Roger Nierman, Beverley Willoughby, Abby Rosemann, Judy Engalage and Pastor Jay Wiesner. Council members absent: Aaron Wilber.

<u>Secretary Report:</u> This report was read and a motion was made to approve the report by Abby Rosemann, and seconded by Paul Saunders. The motion passed. Correspondence was received from Brian Minzes regarding a donation to the church. Roland Niemann agreed to contact him in regards to this.

<u>Financial Secretary Report:</u> This report was read and a motion was made to approve by Beverley Willoughby and seconded by Judy Engelage. The motion passed.

General Treasurer Report: The report was reviewed. Roland Niemann made a motion to approve the report and Paul Saunders seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Jay Wiesner brought up some topics for discussion related to Lenten Services. He suggested that we have the same schedule at each church for Ash Wednesday and Maundy Thursday. It was decided that Immanuel would have services at 7:15 pm on these dates. Midweek Lenten Services were discussed next. Several options were presented. It was determined that Immanuel would have dinner at 6:30 pm and worship service at 7:15pm. Pastor Jay also mentioned that he might not be able to attend all services. Council members agreed to step up and be leaders or find leaders for worship if he could not attend.

We discussed installation of officers. It was considered for March 8th at the beginning of service.

Roland Niemann reported that someone again approached him about adding the Statement of Faith or Apostles' Creed back into service on a more regular basis. Roland has shared this information with Pastor Jay Wiesner and he expressed agreement with this.

Committee Reports

<u>Building & Grounds:</u> Paul Saunders and Kelvin Lashley reported that the batteries have been changed in the smoke detector in the clothing building. They reported that he was the shelf for the defibrillator to be put in a central location. He also noted that there would be signs to direct people to the devices.

Paul reported that the GFI switch in the kitchen is yet to be fixed. Replacing a light globe under the awning is also on the agenda. Paul suggested that we might need to change to a heavier screen that would not tear easily.

A repeating concern is a leak on the chimney of the

clothing building.

Using the same contractor for grass cutting was discussed. Council members expressed satisfaction with the work done during this past year. Kelvin plans to contact Chris Saddler to see if he is still interested in the job.

The HVAC system contract with Schroer Heating and Cooling has expired. We discussed the benefits of having regular checkups in fall and spring and the state of the systems currently. It was determined that we would like to contact them for another proposal.

<u>Christian Workers:</u> Judy Engelage reported that our attendance in January resulted in 204 people in attendance, with a weekly average of 51

Evangelism & Stewardship: Abby Rosemann reported that she would be getting out the large wooden cross to put flowers on at Easter. Pastor Jay has some ideas for doing something new or different for Easter service. Roger Nierman said that he would take care of changing the historic brick sign. She is also looking for palms to burn for ashes for Ash Wednesday.

Abby also got prices for the mailings to our less active members. It would cost \$165 to mail out 200. Judy Engelage made a motion for Abby to get printed and mailed the postcards to inactive members at Immanuel. Beverley Willoughby seconded the motion. It passed. Council members offered to help prepare these for mailing.

Memorial: The memorial committee funds were discussed as possibly being used for composite decking replacement on stairs at the north side of Fellowship Hall. Terry Leap was going to call back about the chairs for the council table that had been discussed earlier in 2019.

<u>Pastor Relations:</u> No new concerns were brought up at this time.

#### Sub Committees

<u>Christian Board:</u> This group will be visiting the St. Louis Aquarium in March. They will be hosting the Birthday Dinner on February 16, 2020.

Women's Fellowship: This group has no new information at this time.

<u>Evening Circle:</u> This group will be helping with the Sausage Dinner on March 8, 2020.

Men's' Club: The Men's' Club is preparing for the Sausage Dinner to be held on March 8, 2020. A possible project that may be completed with funds from this dinner may be putting composite decking where the treated wooden ones are currently on the north side of Fellowship Hall.
