### COUNCIL MEETING - August 11, 2019

The meeting was called to order, and began with a prayer, by Kelvin Lashley.

Council members present: Kelvin Lashley, Paul Saunders, Donna Jones, Roland Niemann, Mary Sue Sitton, and Abby Roseman.

Council members absent: Beverley Willoughby, Terry Leap, and Aaron Wilber.

<u>Secretary Report:</u> This report was read and a motion was made to approve the amended report by Roland Niemann and seconded by Paul Saunders. The motion passed.

<u>Financial Secretary Report:</u> This report was read and a motion was made to approve by Abby Roseman and seconded by Mary Sue Sitton. The motion passed.

General Treasurer Report: The reports for May, June, and July were read by the council. Paul Saunders made a motion to approve the reports for these 3 months. Roland Niemann seconded the motion and the motion passed.

<u>Pastor's Report:</u> Kelvin Lashley reported that he has made arrangements for pastors for all of September and October. Kelvin Lashley reported some suggestions for improving the experience for the pastor, made by Pastor Kelsey Peterson as we move forward. They are as follows:

- Make sure the pastor knows about events at the church well ahead of time.
- Make sure that the pastor knows about functions at Fellowship Hall well ahead of time
- Make sure the pastor knows about any members being sick or ill
- Move the council meetings to a time that the pastor can attend.

The Council discussed ways that we might accomplish these goals. One suggestion was to use the pastor's personal cell phone or email as a point of contact to share this information instead of just the church numbers or leaving messages on the desk in the office. The Council is looking into other ways for sharing this information more quickly with the pastor. The movement of the council meeting would not have to be discussed until the starting time for Sunday services would change again. With council meetings after a 10:30 service, the pastor could stay to attend.

### Committee Reports

<u>Building & Grounds:</u> Paul Saunders noted that when the old stove would be moved that a trailer would be needed and at least 4 strong men. Paul also noted that he was looking into fixing the back steps and decking on Fellowship Hall for some repairs.

The committee is looking into repairing the gate around the dumpster and something new may needed to be put in place if they cannot find a way to repair the existing fence and gate that conceals the trash dumpster.

Mary Sue Sitton observed that the screens along the ramp are torn and may require replacement.

Kelvin said that he was working on a way to change the sign with the worship time more easily.

<u>Christian Workers:</u> Mary Sue Sitton reported that our attendance for 4 Sundays in July resulted in 207 people in attendance, with a weekly average of 52.

<u>Evangelism & Stewardship:</u> Abby Roseman reported that the bin for the backpack program would be out until August 19.

Memorial: Bids are still being sought for the memorial project brought up by Darrell Schmidt.

<u>Pastor Relations:</u> Aaron Wilber had no further concern brought to him at this time.

Women's' Fellowship: No concerns were reported at this time.

Evening Circle: No concerns were reported at this time.

Men's' Club: Men's' group will be preparing for their dinner in March.

Old Business: No old business was discussed.

With no further business to discuss, Mary Sue Sitton made the motion to adjourn and Abby Roseman seconded. The meeting ended with the Lord's Prayer.
