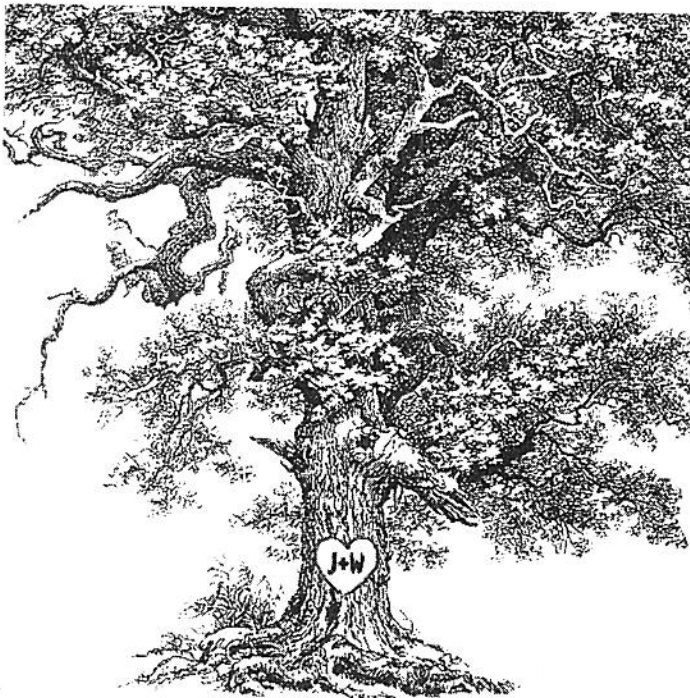

## FROM THE PASTOR:

### "A Time to Celebrate"

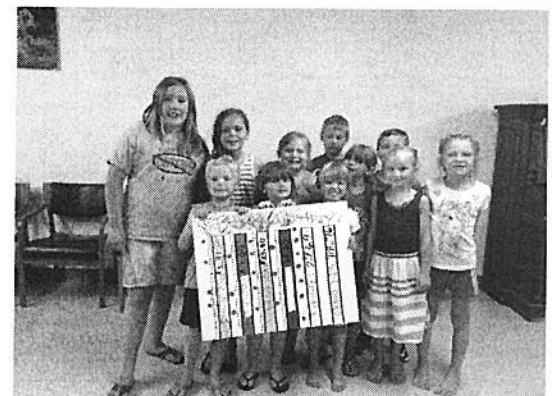
### "BUGS ALIVE"
