

# COUNCIL MEETING -July 14, 2019

The meeting was called to order, and began with a prayer, by Paul Saunders.

Council members present: Kelvin Lashley, Paul Saunders, Donna Jones, Roland Niemann, Mary Sue Sitton, Aaron Wilber, Abby Roseman, and Terry Leap. Council members absent: Kelvin Lashley, Beverley Willoughby Guests: Mildred Groeper, Loretta Buescher, Alice Windmann

<u>Secretary Report:</u> This report was read and a motion was made to approve by Terry Leap and seconded by Aaron Wilber. The motion passed.

<u>Financial Secretary Report:</u> This report was read and a motion was made to approve by Mary Sue Sitton and seconded by Terry Leap. The motion passed.

<u>General Treasurer Report:</u> There was no report at this time.

<u>Pastor's Report:</u> It was suggested that we have all church meetings 2 times per year to keep people informed, that council meetings be set so that the pastor can attend some of the meetings, and that our council and the council of Zion UCC meet to share information at least quarterly and to discuss what is working well and what might need to improve in our partnership.

#### Concerns Presented by Guests:

- A question has arisen about the responsible party for the supply of paper towels and toilet paper for Fellowship Hall.
- Faucets are not working in women's bathroom in Fellowship Hall basement.
- Freezer in Fellowship Hall kitchen had been unplugged and food was thrown out. It is unclear which group might be unplugging kitchen appliances. The women put at tag on the electrical cord to remind people using the kitchen to not unplug this appliance.
- There is a need for a new vented exhaust fan in the kitchen.
- When a stove or other appliances in the kitchen are removed, the guests would like to be informed so that they can clean the wall and floor thoroughly.
- When preparing for luncheons the guests expressed a need for more refrigeration space.
- The guests would like to see more information in the newsletter about what is going on in church and more detail about what topics are discussed at council meetings. An example given was that with more information about the needs of the church, donations could be sought for items needed by the church or groups within the church. A copy of the spring newsletter of Zion UCC in Troy stated that starting time for worship would change to 9:00am on June 30th. The guests requested a congregational meeting to discuss Immanuel UCC worship starting time.

#### Committee Reports

<u>Building & Grounds:</u> This group will look at faucets upon completion of the meeting. One was fixed. The other will need to be replaced and a new faucet installed. Plans will be made to scrap the old stove and the guests will be notified so that the floor and wall can be cleaned before any new appliances come in. Per the request of the guests, Roland Niemann has agreed to take on the job of getting toilet paper and paper towel supplies for Fellowship Hall.

<u>Christian Workers:</u> Mary Sue Sitton reported that our attendance for 4 Sundays in June resulted in 234 people in attendance, with a weekly average of 47.

Evangelism & Stewardship: Abby Roseman reported that the church would be taking part in a food collection during August for the backpack program through the school. Single serve items that children could eat at home on the weekends are focus of this food collection. Items need to be non perishable and can be microwavable. Examples include applesauce, macaroni and cheese, granola bars, and other meal items that do not require refrigeration.

<u>Memorial:</u> The memorial project suggested by Darrell Schmidt through Beverley Willoughby has one bid. Other bids are still being sought.

<u>Pastor Relations:</u> Aaron Wilber had no concerns other than those mentioned prior in these minutes.

#### **Sub Committees**

<u>Christian Board:</u> Terry Leap reported that Vacation Bible School will be the last week of July. All supplies that have been asked for have been donated.

Women's' Fellowship: Concerns brought by guests. No other report at this time.

<u>Evening Circle:</u> This group recently met. No new concerns were bought at that time.

Men's' Club: Men's' group has updated the landscaping in the front of church and Fellowship Hall.

Old Business: No old business was discussed.

#### New Business

Upon consultation of the Constitution and By-Laws, it was determined that in order to give 2 weeks of notice prior to a Congregational Meeting, it would need to be set on August 4, 2019 to discuss the start times for worship at Immanuel UCC moving forward. A congregational meeting was set for August 4, 2019 following worship service to discuss that one topic.

The Council invites any and all interested members to consider one of the 3 council positions that will be up for election in January, 2020. Please prayerfully consider giving your time and talent to the church in this way. Feel free to contact any council members with questions.

# **COUNCIL MEETING CONTINUED FROM JULY 14**

If any group would like more of their information reported in the council minutes, please make sure that the information to be shared is sent to a council member prior to meetings on the second Sunday of each month.

With no further business to discuss, Roland Niemann made the motion to adjourn and Mary Sue Sitton seconded. The meeting ended with the Lord's Prayer.

# Congregational Meeting August 4, 2019

The meeting was called to order by Kelvin Lashley, Council President.

It was determined that a quorum was present with 39 members present.

Kelvin addressed the topic for the meeting as starting time for worship. He acknowledged that the change was not made as in our original agreement at a past congregational meeting. In knowing that Pastor Kelsey's time with us might be short, we did not make the change until we knew more about her departure.

In order to have a full time pastor, it seems that Immanuel would benefit most from staying in partnership with another church. In order to compromise with Zion UCC in Troy, who is used to 9 months of one start time and 3 months of another, it was proposed that we vote on which start time we would like to have for the next 6 months- 9:30 or 10:30 am.

For now, starting in September, we will be sharing the same substitute pastors, Jay Weisner, and Susan Shumway for communion Sundays.

Judy Engelage asked about the Troy church and what their wants are.

Kelvin responded that in speaking with Mende Kemper, their council president they were willing to be flexible with us but would also be meeting soon after the results of this meeting are shared.

Bill Flesch asked how long Pastor Kelsey would be here. Kelvin responded that she would be here until August 25, 2019.

Also the question was asked if the time mattered to the 2 substitute pastors. Kelvin's response was that it did not

matter to them since they had done some substituting for us in our current partnership so that they are aware of the situation coming in to it.

The ballot was explained. Members were to circle the time that they would like for worship to start beginning on September 1st for a 6 month period.

Bill Flesch asked if it did not matter to you as an individual then you could choose not to vote. Kelvin confirmed that statement.

Paper ballots were passed out and returned. The results are as follows:

10:30 am - 34 9:00 am - 3 Blank - 2

Worship will start at 10:30 am beginning in September 2019.

Lee Fast made a motion to adjourn the meeting. David Cox seconded the motion and the meeting was adjourned.

Unite Wright City held a beautiful time in the park recently to help families prepare for back to school bringing together several groups to help! Great job for our Wright City neighbors in need!

We are now looking to upcoming months and seeking churches who would like to host the community Thanksgiving Service, Sun. Oct 24<sup>th</sup>, 6pm or Easter Sunrise Service, Sun. April 12<sup>th</sup>, 2020. Thank you very much to Harmonie Church who hosted our previous Thanksgiving Service and Wesley-Smith UMC who hosted our Easter Sunrise Service this past year. It was such a great time to be together as one family and worship our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ! Please let me know if you would like to host.

**Food Pantry** 

The pantry opens on the second and fourth Saturday of the month and by appointment. We will be open this Saturday, 8/24 @ 9am. There is still deer meat. Stop by and get some. It is time to move it on. We handed out food for: 74 people in May, 70 people in June, and 70 people in July.

The Summer Lunch Program began on July 1<sup>st</sup> and ran through Aug. 14<sup>th</sup>. Our focus is on food for children and teens but the lunches are for everyone. During the 6 ½ weeks that the school cafeteria was closed we served a sack lunch in the Brookview/Northridge Apartments area, Monday - Friday. After serving an hour each day in that location we took any leftover lunches to other families in need in the area. We served a total of 1,517 lunches during the 33 days. This program was totally funded by donations from our community and totally staffed by volunteers. Over 150 volunteers hours were logged! Praise the Lord! The Lord does great things!

Thank you to YOU, the churches of Wright City, and to the many other businesses, and people who have donated to the pantry. Your investment into the purpose of the pantry helps children, teens, and families remain stable in their most vulnerable times. You give life!

Oct. 22<sup>nd</sup> the pantry will be announcing details for the 2019 Holiday Drive at the monthly Chamber of Commerce meeting. There will be opportunities to give toward food baskets for the poor and adopt a family for Christmas. Plus we are adding a toy drive for needy kids in Wright City. It is going to be an awesome holiday season! Plan to be a part.
